Introduction to BUGS

Black Urban Growers (BUGS) is an organization committed to building networks and community support for Black growers in both urban and rural settings. Through education and advocacy around food and farm issues, we nurture collective Black leadership to ensure we have a seat at the table.

In November of 2009, Black Urban Growers began organizing and hosting a series of community events with the purpose of starting a conversation around food: Where does it come from? Who is providing it? Why don't we see more Black farmers at the farmer's markets? What is the relationship between our individual health and the health of our communities, and why does it matter?

Since 2010, we've convened the <u>Black Farmers & Urban Gardeners</u> <u>Conference</u>, a national conference bringing together Black farmers, food justice advocates, educators, chefs and concerned members of Black communities from across the country to share best practices and build a stronger network of Black leadership in the movement for food and land justice as well as food sovereignty.

Our Programs

Dating back to 2010, BUGS has convened the "Black Farmers and Urban Gardeners Conference" annually. While it began as a conference hosted in New York City and included mostly Black farmers and urban gardeners from the NYC metro area, it has since been hosted in cities across the country, attracting hundreds of like-minded attendees each year, working towards goals of food justice and sovereignty. The conference has led to the development of a successful social media presence with a Facebook Page boasting over 19,000 "likes," a Twitter following (@BlackGrowers) of several hundred people and a dynamic Instagram account (@blackfarmersconf) that informs and educates public audiences. By coming together each year to share our stories, skills, resources and best practices BUGS has created a space for emerging leaders within the Black food and land justice communities. We have created food sovereignty movements that are both for us and by us; and are unique to the U.S.-based food, and larger environmental justice movements.

This is a temporary position of 6 months. Remote work is possible. Compensation for this contract is \$23,000.
