POSITION DESCRIPTION

This position provides general support for research and analysis projects, including conducting literature reviews; programming surveys into Vista, a web-based data collection survey site; cleaning, preparing and analyzing data; producing routine data management reports; and preparing presentation materials. Researcher II also produces ad hoc data analytics reports.

Major Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist with research design and hypothesis development.
- Assist with instrument development, including focus group or interview protocols and surveys.
- Assist with data collection, including developing system data-sharing agreements with agencies, developing download protocols, and transferring data to NCCD. Assist with collection, entry, cleaning, and checking of survey and interview data with supervision.
- Assist with conducting data analysis, including coding and summarizing qualitative data, completing basic statistical analysis, assisting with inferential data analysis and statistical models, and compiling reports on pre-processed data sets with SPSS or SQL.
- Assist with report writing and conducting literature reviews.
- Assist with presentation of research findings to clients, with supervision.
- Keep project manager and/or supervisor regularly informed of work progress, schedule, and other relevant information.

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Knowledge/Skill Requirements

- Basic to intermediate knowledge of SPSS and SQL programming, with ability to use critical thinking and logical structures to inform coding choices.
- Basic understanding of relational database structures (ERDs), data dictionaries, and codebooks.
- Knowledge of child welfare, juvenile justice, education, adult criminal justice, and/or adult protective services.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills.
- Bachelor's degree in social science or technical field, such as math, computer science, statistics, or engineering.
